Six Central Ohio Nonprofits Selected as 2021 Change for Charity Recipients:

Diverse organizations that impact families affected by the pandemic and promote social justice to receive funds from Easton Community Foundation

[Columbus, OH] December 1, 2020 – Celebrating Easton's 22nd year of giving, the <u>Easton Community Foundation</u> will partner with six community organizations for its 2021 Change for Charity program. The Easton Community Foundation selects six area nonprofits to highlight throughout the property so that Easton's 30 million annual visitors are aware of each organization's mission, community impact, and also how to access their services. In addition, the nonprofits receive a portion of the parking meter and ticket revenue to support their community efforts. With more than 100 applications submitted for consideration, the following six non-profits have been selected and will be featured throughout Easton over a two-month period:

Greater Columbus Arts Council (January / February)
YWCA Columbus (March / April)
Local Matters (May / June)
Per Scholas (July / August)
Dress for Success Columbus (September / October)
Huckleberry House, Inc. (November / December)

Since its debut, the Easton Community Foundation has provided over \$8 million in financial support to hundreds of organizations that strengthen the central Ohio community through services and programming in the areas of education, health and social services. Its primary community-focused initiatives – in addition to the Change for Charity program – include Cornerstone Event fundraisers for some of central Ohio's most respected charities, the Easton Community Foundation Scholarships for area high schools and events and partnerships benefiting the community and local organizations such as Pink Ribbon Girls' Survivor Walk, Columbus Music Commission's Instrument Drive, A Kid Again's Annual 5K Capes and Gowns Race, the Furniture Bank of Central Ohio's Bed Race and many more.

Due to the pandemic, the Easton Community Foundation developed Feeding the Frontline, a partnership with Easton restaurants to deliver more than nearly 4,000 meals to hospital staff, doctors, nurses and other frontline workers. Easton partnered with the American Red Cross to host nineteen community blood drives in the Easton Community Room. Following a summer drive-in utilizing the parking lot north of the New District in which proceeds benefited the Easton Community Foundation, Easton converted the space into the Easton Community Drive-In for two weeks this fall. Here, the Easton Community Foundation hosted multiple successful non-profit events including the Nationwide Children's Hospital Pay-It-Forward, Fashion Week



Columbus Finale Runway Show as well as Amethyst Portraits of Recovery, Thrive-In, NC4K, Pelotonia's All In and Dress for Success Beyond the Suit events.

Most recently, Easton has served as a site for the King Arts Complex (in the former Forever 21 space), the LSS CHOICES "Clothesline Project" (currently on display in the Fenlon Garage corridor), Besa voter registration events and an event for Franklin County Public Health to pack more than 1,000 "go bags" for communities with high rates of opioid overdoses. While Change for Charity provides a unique opportunity for six select organizations, Easton is dedicated to working with the community and creating accessible opportunities to benefit the many incredible organizations Columbus has to offer all year round.

"2020 has been especially challenging for everyone, businesses and non-profits alike," said Jennifer Peterson, Chief Executive of Easton. "We witnessed the needs of our community through every application for the 2021 Change for Charity program. Our hearts go out to all who have been negatively impacted by this pandemic and the additional stress that it has put on both organizations and individuals. Our focus this year is on supporting organizations specifically impacting our community members affected by the pandemic as well as those with a strong mission to promote social justice. Our goal is to support and recognize these organizations that are making a significant impact as well as raise awareness of opportunities for our Easton guests to get involved in making our community a better place to live."

Each partner receives a substantial donation through Easton's parking meter proceeds along with in-kind marketing and publicity opportunities that reach more than 30 million visitors annually.

YWCA Columbus is dedicated to eliminating racism and empowering women. YWCA Columbus defies a status quo that puts women, people of color, and the underprivileged on uneven footing. By fostering dialogue, providing practical resources, and education, they

promote empowerment and inclusion. YWCA Columbus initiates systematic social change that will create a Columbus of peace, justice freedom and dignity for all. Standing up against injustices, training the leaders of tomorrow, and caring for the wellbeing of our most vulnerable friends and neighbors has always been their strength. Today, that work has taken on new dimension, urgency and importance. In 2020, they served more than 5,000 individuals and families. YWCA Columbus will continue to create a more equitable Franklin county and serve as the safety net for people who are vulnerable, marginalized, or experiencing crisis. In October, more than 1,000 individuals listened, learned, and reflected with YMCA Columbus during 2020 Activists and Agitators, their first *virtual* racial equity training. YWCA Columbus created Activists and Agitators with the belief that anyone and everyone can be an agent for social change.



Local Matters

(May / June): Local Matters works to build healthy communities through food education, access, and advocacy. Across Central Ohio, our neighbors have inequitable access to food options that are healthy, affordable, and delicious.

Local Matters offers food retail and education programs designed to address these inequities for everyone from pre-schoolers to senior citizens. Through their Veggie Van, Food Matters, and more, Local Matters reaches over 23,000 individuals and families with life-changing work each year.



Per Scholas

(July / August): Per Scholas has been advancing economic mobility in Central Ohio since 2012. Through rigorous training, professional development, and robust employer connections, they prepare individuals traditionally underrepresented in technology for

high-growth careers in the industry. They partner with leading employers to build more diverse talent pools, directly connecting graduates to new career opportunities with leading employers, from Fortune 500 companies to innovative startups. To-date, Per Scholas has trained nearly 800 individuals through their Columbus campus, building bridges to careers in technology.



Dress for Success Columbus

(September / October): Dress for Success empowers women to achieve economic independence by providing a network of support, professional attire, and the career development tools

to help her thrive in work and in life. All programs, including Interview and Employment Suiting, Career Center, Interviewing for Success, Professional Women's Group, Women2Women Mentoring, and Boss Girl are free of charge for every woman. Dress for Success Columbus has expanded serves to meet more women where they are during this critical time. In 2020, the organization launched its Mobile Career Center - taking empowerment on the road! Last year,



Dress for Success prepared more than 1,800 women, and with the community's support the team has empowered more than 18,000 women since opening its doors in 2017.



Huckleberry House, Inc.

(November / December): Huckleberry House, Inc. provides comprehensive support and safe housing to empower our community's most

vulnerable youth to achieve the future they see for themselves. Founded in 1970 as a shelter for runaway teens, Huck House works to prevent and end youth homelessness with a teen crisis shelter, a range of housing options, a youth outreach team, transitional housing for the 18-24 year-old age group, and strengths-based counseling services for youth and families.
